All 254 Texas Counties Now Offer Online Vehicle Registration Renewal

New Year brings new online option for all Texans

AUSTIN, Texas – March 6, 2014. The Texas Legislature, [Texas Department of Motor Vehicles](#) (TxDMV), and [Texas.gov](#) just made it easier for Texans to [renew their vehicle registration](#). As of January 1, 2014, all 254 Texas counties offer the option for online renewals – a simple, secure way to keep your vehicle registration current. All you need to get started is your license plate and VIN numbers, your insurance information, and a valid credit card. The [online renewal option](#) is growing in popularity as more Texas vehicle owners realize that renewing online offers significant time savings and overall convenience. In 2013, more than 2.5 million vehicle registrations were renewed online, a 23 percent increase over 2012. TxDMV takes convenience one step further by offering an email reminder service, [eReminder](#) – you provide your email address and they'll send you a reminder when your vehicle registration is due.
